Amblyopia

Lazy Eye, or amblyopia, is the loss or lack of development of central vision in one eye that is unrelated to any eye health problem and is not correctable with lenses. It can result from a failure to use both eyes together. Lazy Eye is often associated with cross-eyes or a large difference in the degree of nearsightedness or farsightedness between the the two eyes. It usually develops before age six and it does not affect side vision.

Strabismus

Strabismus occurs when one or both eyes turns in, out, up or down. Poor eye muscle control usually causes strabismus. This misalignment often first appears before age 21 months but may develop as late as age 6 years.
