Uveitis

Uveitis is swelling and irritation of the uvea, the middle layer of the eye. The uvea provides most of the blood supply to the retina. Uveitis can affect one or both eyes. Symptoms may develop rapidly and can include blurred vision, dark, floating spots in the vision, eye pain, redness of the eye and sensitivity to light. Regular eye exams are important for the health of your eyes - with proper treatment, most attacks of anterior uveitis go away in a few days to weeks. Inflammation related to posterior uveitis may last from months to years and may cause permanent vision damage, even with treatment.
